

# VOTING RECORD

YOUR LEGISLATORS' VOTING RECORD ON SMALL BUSINESS ISSUES

**2007–2008 SESSION:** Votes cast by members of the Vermont General Assembly on bills or amendments of particular interest to small business owners during the past two legislation sessions are listed below. Although this *Voting Record* cannot reflect every deliberation that legislators take into consideration when casting a particular vote, this record serves as a guide for the purpose of evaluating lawmakers on their understanding of issues important to small business. Please thank those legislators who assisted NFIB efforts to promote and protect the rights of our members to own, operate and grow their businesses.

## HOUSE VOTES:

1. Override Veto of Energy Legislation, H.520: The 2007 vote was to determine whether Gov. Jim Douglas' veto of legislation that would have created an all-fuels utility, funded with a \$25 million tax on Vermont Yankee, should be overridden. A **"No" vote supports the NFIB position.** The measure failed in the House 86–61; 92 votes were needed to override.
2. Workers' Compensation, S.345: The 2008 vote on an amendment offered by Rep. Pat MacDonald that would have achieved true savings for Vermont small businesses by enhancing workplace safety; restructuring benefits levels; improving fraud enforcement and return-to-work programs; and providing an approximate 5 to 10 percent premium savings to small businesses. A **"Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment failed 44–88.
3. Energy Legislation, S.373: The 2008 vote on this bill would have required the owner of Vermont Yankee to put up more than \$400 million in cash or financial guarantees to cover immediate decommissioning costs if the power

facility's license is not renewed in 2012. The cost of this tax would have been passed on to Vermont ratepayers in the form of higher electricity costs in the future. A **"No" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 82–60.

4. Healthcare, H.887: The 2008 vote on an amendment offered by Rep. Heidi Scheuermann would have removed two health insurance mandates from the bill: "post-divorce" coverage and "adult children" coverage. Additional mandates, particularly when there are alternate ways to achieve the same goal, would put upward pressure on health insurance premiums being paid by small business owners and their workers. A **"Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment failed 50–91.

5. Healthcare, H.887: The 2008 vote on legislation shifting more of the cost to employer and employee private health plans by making modifications to existing health insurance and healthcare statutes, adding to the list of 24 existing mandates and expanding Catamount Health Plan. Numerous amendments aimed at minimizing the bill's negative

impact failed. A **"No" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 87–55.

6. Affordable Housing, H.863: The 2008 vote on legislation that would have encouraged affordable housing in villages and towns and provided disincentives for building outside the village or town center. A **"No" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 79–61; however, later in the session, legislation that was much less onerous finally passed.

7. Property Tax; 2 vote, H.864: The 2008 vote on legislation that included a provision to repeal the two-part vote passed during the last biennium (Act 82) intending to lower the need for higher property taxes to support education financing. A **"No" vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill, including the repeal of Act 82, passed 99–38. This repeal later died in the Senate.

8. Capital Gains Tax, H.888: The 2008 vote on an amendment offered by Rep. Chris Pearson would have removed the 40 percent capital gains exclusion from individual income tax for gains over \$10,000. A **"No" vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment failed 37–97.

9. Card Check for Unionization, H.353: The 2007 vote on an amendment that would have authorized a study of certain unions to access workplaces for the purpose of persuading workers to sign cards instead of providing an opportunity for workers to cast secret ballots. A **"Yes" vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment failed 55–82.

**10.** Card Check for Unionization, H.353: The 2007 vote on legislation that authorized certain unions to access workplaces for the purpose of persuading workers to sign cards instead of providing an opportunity for workers to cast secret ballots. A **“No” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 78–59. This legislation died in the Senate.

**11.** Property Taxes, H.526: The 2007 vote on a bill that would have reduced the upward curve on property taxes by reining in the rate of increase on school budgets. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 70–60. Other amendments that were offered to reduce property taxes also failed.

**SENATE VOTES:**

**1.** Energy Efficiency/\$25 Million Tax, H.520: This 2007 vote was to pass an amendment stripping out the \$25 million tax on one entity—Vermont Yankee. The legislation’s purpose was to encourage the amount of energy produced in Vermont through renewable energy sources and to create an all-fuels utility. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment failed 7–23. (Gov. Douglas vetoed H.520.)

**2.** Energy Efficiency/\$25 Million Tax, H.520: This 2007 vote was to pass legislation to increase the amount of energy produced in Vermont and create an all-fuels utility that would be funded with a \$25 million tax on one entity—Vermont

Yankee. A **“No” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 15–14. (Gov. Douglas vetoed H.520.)

**3.** Property Taxes, H.526: The 2007 vote on a bill that would have reduced the upward curve on property taxes by reining in the rate of increase on school budgets. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 23–4. However, all efforts in the House failed.

**4.** Minimum Wage, S.27: This 2007 amendment proposed by Sens. John Campbell, Hinda Miller and James Condos removed a 14 cent increase in the minimum wage rate for tipped employees, leaving the cost of living increase in the bill. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment passed 24–4. However, NFIB opposed the underlying legislation.

**5.** Energy Efficiency/Using Existing Funds, S.94: This 2007 vote was to pass legislation for the purposes of establishing an all-fuels utility without funding; money would have to be found within existing budgets. A **“No” vote supports the NFIB position.** The legislation passed 26–3. Although we support energy efficiency, we opposed this legislation without funding.

**6.** Affordable Housing, H.863: The 2008 vote on legislation that intended to stimulate the economy and provide for new housing opportunities. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 26–4.

**7.** Healthcare, H.887: The 2008 vote on legislation favorably modifying the House-passed version of the healthcare reform initiative, removing several mandates and somewhat limiting the cost shift to private-pay insureds. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 29–0. Although NFIB remains concerned about continued reform efforts, this version of the legislation was much less burdensome.

**8.** Workers’ Compensation Reform, S.345: The 2008 vote on legislation to continue to keep workers’ compensation reform discussions going throughout the 2008 session. Without the bill, efforts would have been stymied. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The bill passed 28–0. However, the House chose not to deal with this issue in a meaningful way.

**9.** Greenhouse Gas Registry, S.350: The 2008 vote on an amendment offered by Sen. Vincent Illuzzi would have minimized the burden of a Vermont greenhouse gas registry on business by aligning the registration requirements with those of other states. A **“Yes” vote supports the NFIB position.** The amendment failed 11–18.
