YOUR LEGISLATORS' VOTING RECORD ON SMALL-BUSINESS ISSUES | 2007 EDITION

**Issues: 2004–2007 Sessions** Roll-call votes by your state legislators on the following key small-business issues during the current four-year term (2004–2007) of the Mississippi Legislature are listed inside. Included are several tort-reform votes to reflect a legislator's continuous support. Although this *Voting Record* does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislator's attitude toward small business. Please remember that many issues on which small businesses are affected did not go to a roll-call vote in either the House or Senate. Please thank those who supported small business.

**HOUSE AND SENATE ISSUES:****1. Business-Sign Fees (SB 2754):**

Prohibits cities and counties from imposing multiple annual fees and privilege taxes on a business' sign that advertises its name, products and services. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 113–7, A-2; passed the Senate 47–4, A-1. (2004)

**2. Bad-Check Fees (SB 2911):**

Increases the amount a business can charge for a bad check from the current \$30 to \$40. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 81–35, A-6; passed the Senate 52–0. (2004)

**3. Unemployment Tax (SB 2480):**

Reduces the 2005 minimum tax rate from the current law's formula rate of 1.7 percent to 0.9 percent, a 47 percent reduction; and authorizes a first-time diversion of one-third of the 0.9 percent tax rate for workforce training. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 73–46, A-2, V-1; passed the Senate 46–0, A-6. (2005)

**4. HSA Tax Deduction (SB 2633):**

Allows a state tax deduction, similar to the federal, for employer and employee contributions to health savings accounts. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Conference Report

passed the House 118–3, V-1; passed the Senate 52–0. (2005)

**5. Duty to Retreat (SB 2426):**

Protects business owners, employees and others from liability when defending oneself or others in a place of business, home, vehicle, etc. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed and amended by the House 115–3, A-4; concurred by the Senate 39–10, A-2, V-1. (2006)

**6. Eminent Domain (SB 2152):**

Senate-passed version attempted to respond to the *Kelo* decision of U.S. Supreme Court as protection of private-property rights, but included loopholes similar to the *Kelo* case. The House-passed version (same as HB 300) more fully protected private property under *Kelo*. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position in the House; a "No" vote supports the NFIB position in the Senate. Died in Conference. Passed the House 120–0, A-1, V-1; passed the Senate 52–0. (2007)

**7. Medium Truck Regulatory Exemption (SB 3042):**

Exempts commercial trucks weighing up to 26,000 pounds and used only within Mississippi from burdensome federal and state regulations. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 119–0, A-2, V-1; passed the Senate 52–0. (2007)

**8. Bad-Check Attorney's Fees (SB 2431):**

Allows a business to add attorney's fees in a legal collection proceeding. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 87–31, A-3, V-1; passed the Senate 52–0. (2007)

**ADDITIONAL HOUSE ISSUES:****9. House Rules (HR 39):**

Rep. Ellington's amendment attempted to delete the section of the House's rules that increased the vote required to withdraw a bill from a committee to the floor from long-standing 50 percent of members to two-thirds. The rules change effectively prevented any chance of withdrawing any tort-reform bills from committee for a House vote. A "Yes" vote supports the NFIB position. Failed the House 50–72. (2004)

**10. Tort-Reform Package (HB 2):**

This was a weak proposal of the trial-lawyer leadership of the House. A "No" vote supports the NFIB position. Failed the House 52–63, A-6, V-1. (2004, first special session)

**11. Tort-Reform Package (HB 4):**

A weaker House-passed version was strengthened greatly with a Senate-passed amendment. If the House concurred with the NFIB-backed Senate amendments, it would have been

sent to the governor; however, the House invited conference instead by vote of 58–56. An attempt to reconsider vote again failed on motion to table. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Motion to table the motion to reconsider failed the House 60–59, A-2, V-1. (2004, first special session)

**12. Tort-Reform Package (HB 13):** Included the most comprehensive civil-justice reform passed in our nation. This vote attempted to invite conference in lieu of concurring with the Senate amendments supported by NFIB. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Failed the House 48–68, A-5, V-1. (2004, first special session)

**13. Tort-Reform Package (HB 13):** Included the most comprehensive civil-justice reform passed in our nation. This vote concurred with the Senate, which passed NFIB-endorsed amendments. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 75–39, A-6, V-1. (2004, first special session)

**14. Tort Reform—Innocent Seller Protection (HB 13):** Rep. Jim Ellington’s Amendment No. 10 provides protection from liability to innocent sellers of products who are not actually negligent. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 76–40, A-5, V-1. (2004, first special session)

**15. Multimillion-Dollar Fee (Tax)/Revenue Package (HB 1279):** Attempts to fill an estimated \$700 million state budget hole. Included multimillion-dollar fee increases on DEQ, auto titles, vanity tags, audit fees and UCC filings; limited discount for businesses that collect and pay sales tax in a timely fashion to only one business location. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed House 94–28. (2004)

**16. \$55 Million Fee (Tax) Package (HB 1409):** Increases on fees and licenses for state agency services. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 77–42, A-3. (2005)

**17. Consumer Protection Class-Action Lawsuits (HB 1113):** Attorney General Hood-endorsed effort to allow private attorneys to bring class-action lawsuits on consumer-protection matters against

business under the AG’s authority. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Motion to suspend rules (two-thirds vote) to take up bill failed the House 61–56, A-5. (2005)

**18. Living Wage (HB 237):** Rep. Joey Hudson’s amendment deleting the provision that set an annual living-wage increase for a state minimum wage. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 64–54, A-4. (2007)

**19. Minimum Wage (HB 237):** Would have created a state minimum wage, initially at \$6.25 and increasing to \$7.25 on Jan. 15, 2008. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 68–50, A-4. (2007)

**20. Performance Review (HB 1679):** Appropriations Chairman Stringer included a provision in this legislative appropriation bill requiring an NFIB-endorsed performance review of all of state government. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 120–0, A-1, V-1. (2007)

**21. Department of Labor (HB 1379):** Rep. Evans’ Amendment No. 1 attempted to establish a state Department of Labor in the immigration bill with authority to regulate employment, training, and good and safe working conditions. A “No” vote supports the NFIB position. Failed the House 56–62, A-3, V-1. (2007)

#### ADDITIONAL SENATE ISSUES:

**22. Tort-Reform Package (SB 2763):** This Senate-passed bill was the first major attempt to pass tort reform with backing of Gov. Haley Barbour and Lt. Gov. Amy Tuck; however the House adjourned for the session before considering this bill. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 32–14, A-2. (2004)

**23. Tort-Reform Package (SB 2001):** Upon Gov. Barbour calling the Legislature into special session for tort reform, the Senate quickly passed this significant bill; however, it was never considered by the House. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 30–13, A-3, (3–3). (2004, first special session)

**24. Tort-Reform Package (HB 4):** A weaker House-passed version was strengthened

greatly with a Senate amendment. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. The House invited conference, but never came to an agreement. Passed the Senate 35–9, A-2, (3–3). (2004, first special session)

**25. Tort-Reform Package (HB 13):** Included the most comprehensive civil-justice reform passed in our nation. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 37–11, (2–2). (2004, first special session)

**26. Auto Insurance Consumer Choice (SB 2788):** Attempts to allow all to lower uninsured motorist insurance costs by voluntary choice of non-stacking of vehicles for multiple coverage. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 44–7, A-1. (2004)

**27. Government Efficiency—Operation Streamline (SB 2628):** Gov. Barbour’s proposal to require certain efficiencies in the administration of state government in lieu of tax/fee increases. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 33–16, A-1, (1–1). (2004)

**28. Product Liability (SB 2021):** Provides an exclusive remedy for product-liability cases. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 31–14, A-7. (2007)

**29. Private Attorney Hiring by Attorney General (SB 2482):** Provides sunshine to public and accountability on AG’s hiring of private attorneys to represent the state in lawsuits. A “Yes” vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 32–17, A-3. (2007)
