# Register

**October 7, 2024:** Voter Registration Deadline.

# Voting

All registered voters may vote early in-person. Voters with a valid excuse may vote absentee by mail.

**October 21, 2024:** Early voting begins.

**October 25, 2024:** Deadline for election authority to receive absentee ballot requests.

**November 1, 2024:** Early voting ends.

**November 5, 2024:** Election Day. Deadline to return an in-person absentee ballot.

**November 6, 2024:** Deadline for election authority to receive an absentee ballot postmarked on or before election day.

Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (local time).
