YOUR LEGISLATORS' VOTING RECORD ON SMALL BUSINESS ISSUES | 2023 EDITION

Votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislators' attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

BOTH CHAMBERS

- 1. Rebuild Virginia Grants and Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loans (2022 – HB971): Makes changes to Virginia's tax code to better benefit Virginia's small businesses, including retroactively allows up to \$100,000 of the individual and corporate income tax deduction for Rebuild Virginia Grant Fund program and certain amounts related to PPP loans. The new law also allows full deductibility of expenses paid/incurred with forgiven PPP loan proceeds or Economic Injury Disaster Loan program funding. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 40-0. Passed the House 100-0. Signed by the governor.
- 2. Repealing Changes Made to the Virginia Overtime Wage Act (2022 - HB1173): Replaces onerous provisions of the Virginia Overtime Wage Act, conforming Virginia with existing overtime wage requirements at the federal level. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 33-6. Passed the House 55-42. Signed by the governor.
- 3. Approving the Sale of Paid Family Leave Insurance Policies (2022 SB15): Establishes family leave insurance, allowing employers to offer paid leave insurance as a benefit to pay for employees' income loss due to (i) the birth/adoption/fostering of a child; (ii) care of a family member with a serious health condition; or (iii) or military service. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 37-2-1. Passed the House 99-0. Signed by the governor.
- 4. Reforming the Virginia Employment Commission (2022 - SB219): Requires the Commission to develop and maintain an unemployment insurance Resiliency Plan. Creates an Unemployment Compensation Ombudsman to provide information and help to persons seeking assistance. Directs the State to develop strategies for staffing assistance and support for agencies that might need help during emergencies. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 40-0. Passed the House 100-0. Signed by the governor.

- 5. Creation of Association Health Plans for Real Estate Salespersons (2022 – SB335): Allows for a policy of group accident and sickness insurance to association of real estate salespersons. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 40-0. Passed the House 97-2. Signed by the governor.
- 6. Gas Tax Holiday (2022 HB30 Governor's Budget Amendment #31): Amends gas and diesel tax code to provide for a three-month gas tax suspension. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position in the House. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position in the Senate. Passed the House 55-41. Motion passed in the Senate 21-18.
- 7. Consolidation of Virginia's Workforce Development Policies and Programs Under New Agency (2023 SB1470): Creates the Department of Workforce Development and Advancement by consolidating all workforce programs under one agency. The bill also (i) transfers apprenticeship programs from the Department of Labor and Industry to the Department, (ii) directs the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia to collaborate with the Department to grow and expand the Innovative Internship Fund and Program, and (iii) directs the Secretary of Labor to conduct a comprehensive review of the Commonwealth's workforce development programs. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 40-0. Passed the House 98-0. Signed by the governor.

SENATE ONLY

8. Mandatory Paid Sick Leave for Health Care Providers and Grocery Store Workers (2022 – SB352): Requires employers to provide paid sick leave to health care providers and grocery store workers and removes requirements that employees work on average 20 hours/ week or 90 hours/month to be eligible for paid sick leave. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 21-19.

- Mandatory Paid Sick Leave for Home Health Workers (2022 - SB624): Requires employers to provide paid sick leave to home health workers who provide agencydirected services. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 22-18.
- 10. Prohibition on Employers Asking for Wage or Salary History (2022 SB447): Prohibits an employer from (i) asking wage/salary history; (ii) using wage/salary history in determining compensation; (iii) relying on the wage/salary history in considering a person for employment; (iv) refusing to interview, hire, employ, promote, or otherwise retaliating against a person for not providing wage/salary history; and (v) failing or refusing to provide the wage or salary range prior to discussing compensation. Any employer found in violation is liable for statutory damages between \$1,000 and \$10,000 or actual damages, whichever is greater. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 20-19.

HOUSE ONLY

- Freezing the Minimum Wage (2022 HB320): Repeals scheduled increases above \$11 per hour. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 51-48.
- 9. Repealing the requirement of Project Labor Agreements, Prevailing Wage, and Collective Bargaining (2022 HB883): Provides that state agencies cannot require bidders to have a project labor agreement (PLA). The bill removes mandate for the payment of prevailing wage for work performed on state public contracts. In addition, the bill removes the authority for collective bargaining at the local government level. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 52-47.
- 10. Removing Virginia from Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) (2022 - HB1301): Directs the Department of Environmental Quality to suspend the Commonwealth's participation in the RGGI. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 52-48.
- 11. Qualified Business Income Deduction and Corporate Rate Reduction (2023 HB2138): Increases from 30% to 50% the Virginia individual and corporate income tax deduction for business interest disallowed as a deduction under § 163(j) of the IRS Code beginning in taxable year 2024. The bill allows an individual income tax deduction equal to 50% of certain federal qualified business income deductions. The bill reduces from 6% to 5% the corporate income tax rate beginning in the taxable year 2023. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 52-48.

12. Income Tax Rate Reduction and Standard Deduction (2023 - HB2319): Lowers the top income tax rate from 5.75% to 5.5% for taxable years beginning on January 1, 2024. The bill also raises the standard deduction to \$9,000 for single individuals and \$18,000 for married persons for taxable years beginning on and after January 14, 2024, but before January 1, 2026. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the House 52-48.
