Votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislator's attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

BOTH CHAMBERS

1. Unemployment Insurance Eligibility for Striking Workers (2023 - SB 799): Allows workers who voluntarily separate from the workforce by striking to access state unemployment insurance benefits. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 27-12. Passed the Assembly 59-18. Vetoed by the governor.

2. Establishes New Protected Class (2023 – AB **524):** Seeks to add any individual with "family caregiver status" as a new protected class under California's Fair Employment and Housing Act. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 26-8. Passed the Assembly 49-17. Vetoed by the governor.

3. Minimum Wage Increase (2023 - AB 1228): Increases the minimum wage for certain fast food restaurant workers to \$20 per hour beginning April 2024. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 32-8. Passed the Assembly 53-17. Signed by the governor.

4. Minimum Wage Increase (2023 – SB 525): Requires a health care worker minimum wage of \$21 or \$23 per hour, depending on job classification, starting June 1, 2024, for hours worked in covered health care employment. **A "NO" vote supports the** NFIB position. Passed the Senate 31-9. Passed the Assembly 63-13. Signed by the governor.

5. Workplace Violence Prevention (2023 - SB 553): Requires certain employers to establish, implement, and maintain a workplace violence prevention plan across all job sites and work areas. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 29-8. Passed the Assembly 55-17. Signed by the governor.

6. Paid Sick Leave (2023 - SB 616): Increases the number of paid sick days from three to five and modifies the employer's alternate sick leave accrual method. A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 27-9. Passed the Assembly 52-18. Signed the governor.

7. Private Attorneys General Act Reform

(2024 – AB 2288): Makes changes to various sections of California's Private Attorneys General Act (PAGA) of 2004 to limit employer liability and provide a "cure period" for certain violations among other improvements. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB **position.** Passed the Senate 39-0. Passed the Assembly 77-0. Signed by the governor.

8. Retail Theft and Property Crime (2024 – AB 1972): Expands the scope and jurisdiction of California's Regional Property Crimes Task Force and classifies merchandise stolen from a merchant's cargo as a crime of organized retail theft crime. A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position. Passed the Senate 38-0. Passed the Assembly 75-0. Signed by the governor.
