Votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislator's attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

BOTH CHAMBERS

- 1. Workers' Compensation Changes (2025 – House Bill 66):** Amends the Workers Compensation Act to increase the size of attorney fees that can be collected in workers' compensation cases and increase the amount of money that can be advanced by employers for discovery costs. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 25-14. Passed the House 36-22. Signed by the governor.
- 2. Medical Malpractice Changes (2026 – House Bill 99):** Amends the Medical Malpractice Act to clarify definitions in the Act, limit punitive damages in medical malpractice cases and require payments from the Patient Compensation Fund to be made as expenses are incurred. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 40-2. Passed the House 66-3. Signed by the governor.
- 3. Corporate Income Tax Changes (2026 – Senate Bill 151):** Decouples New Mexico's corporate income tax from three components of the 2025 Federal budget reconciliation bill, P.L. 119-21, commonly known as House Resolution 1, and increases taxes on New Mexico businesses by over \$100 million. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 24-17. Passed the House 43-19. Signed by the governor.
- 4. IRB Project Minimum Wage (2025 – House Bill 6):** Amends the Public Works Minimum Wage Act to require that projects funded through industrial revenue bonds issued by municipalities or counties comply with prevailing wage and fringe benefit requirements determined by the Workforce Solutions Department Labor Relations Division. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 23-15. Passed the House 41-26. Signed by the governor.
- 5. Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Act (2025 – Senate Bill 21):** Establishes a state-run discharge permitting program and, as part of broader changes to New Mexico water law, expands regulatory authority beyond the federal definition of "waters of the United States" following the U.S. Supreme Court's Sackett decision. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 25-16. Passed the House 43-25. Signed by the governor.

HOUSE ONLY

- 6. Paid Family & Medical Leave Act (2025 – House Bill 11):** Proposed to establish Paid Family Medical Leave (PFML) benefit for nearly all workers in the state and would require employee contributions of 0.5 percent and employer contributions of 0.4 percent of wages into the newly established fund. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 38-31.
- 7. Employee Free Speech Act (2025 – House Bill 84):** Prohibits employers from requiring employees to attend workplace communications on political or religious matters and exposes employers to civil liability, including attorney fees and punitive damages, for violations. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 37-27.

SENATE ONLY

- 8. Clear Horizons & Emissions Codification (2026 – Senate Bill 18):** Codifies statewide greenhouse gas emission reduction targets of 45 percent by 2030, 75 percent by 2040 and 100 percent by 2050, and authorizes the Environmental Improvement Board to adopt rules, impose emission limits on stationary sources and establish fees to implement the program. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Failed in the Senate 19-23.
